Unit Focus

In this unit, students will examine how presidents responded to challenges facing the country and the impact of presidential leadership on government and American society. The students will examine various crises related to foreign and domestic politics as well as scandals that were a direct result of personal lapses in judgment. In addition to a unit test, students will compare and rank the presidents through research and analysis. Primary instructional materials for this unit will include primary and secondary sources as well as a U.S. History textbook *The American Pageant or The Americans*, maps and or artifacts.
