

# ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

Students may wish to enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses for the purpose of pursuing college level studies in a specific content area. Students taking AP courses are encouraged to register for the May Advanced Placement Test. All fees for the testing program are paid by the student. Students may request that these test scores be reported to the college in which the student has decided to enroll. Individual colleges determine whether the student is awarded college credit for the AP course as a result of the test. AP courses are planned in the following areas:

# UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT: EARLY COLLEGE EXPERIENCE (ECE)

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University of Connecticut classes provide students the opportunity to take college courses while still in high school. All fees are paid by the student. Registration is held each spring prior to the year the course will be taken. ECE instructors, who are certified as adjunct professors by UConn faculty, create a classroom environment fostering independent learning, creativity, and critical thinking—all pivotal for success in college. To support rigorous learning, University of Connecticut library resources are also available to students. ECE students must successfully complete the course with a grade of C or better in order to receive university credit. University credits are sometimes transferable to other universities.
